5. Letters to the Editor:

- Word Count: Letters should be brief and focused, typically ranging from 500 to 1,000 words.
- Citation Style: APA style for references.
- Formatting: Address specific issues or concerns related to previously published articles, editorials, or commentaries. Provide a clear and concise argument or viewpoint.

6. Educational and Training Materials:

- Word Count: Educational materials can vary in length but should be comprehensive and informative, typically ranging from 2,000 to 5,000 words.
- Citation Style: APA style for references.

- Formatting: Provide detailed tutorials, guides, protocols, or best practice recommendations relevant to clinical performance evaluation and malpractice prevention. Include illustrative examples and practical tips for implementation.
